**Course Description:**

*For researchers, reading to increase knowledge is obviously important. Less obvious is how our reading can improve our writing. In this workshop we'll look at, and practise, efficient reading, strategic reading, 'noticing' reading, and explore how reading can help us develop our own writing style and voice.*

*By the end of the workshop, you should be better able to:*

- *appreciate the value of efficient reading, i.e. asking key questions of your reading*
- *recognize how texts work for the reader*
- *use writerly techniques to achieve readerly effects*
- *put yourself in the shoes of the reader*

**All sessions run by Anne Wilson and Katie Grant are highly interactive. Numbers are limited, with every participant expected to do all required preparation, log-on on time, and contribute actively to the whole session. Writing Retreats require commitment to all the retreat days (2 days for Y1 and Y2; 3 days for Y3), and Writing Group requires commitment for six consecutive weeks. If you sign up and then have to cancel, you must let LISS know immediately. If you don't, you'll be depriving another researcher of the training opportunity.**
