#### **Course Description:**

This course is designed for Ph.D. students of the social sciences who wish to learn how to create their personal academic websites. A personal website is an essential tool to manage your online presence and disseminate your research independently of online platforms and networks. This course covers a series of topics in the form of short lectures with interactive elements. After each lecture participants will be given time to practice and ask questions. Based on the lessons learned in the first session, participants will begin to develop their own personal academic websites. The second session will provide an opportunity to present their website and receive feedback on it. By the end of this course, participants will be able to create, launch and maintain their personal academic websites.
